Valhalla Housekeeping



I think we need a reminder of what is expected when you book Valhalla and your responsibility being the member booking it.

It is a great privilege that we as members of the Danish Society get to rent the holiday home at a very good rate. We are not a Book-a-Bach or any other platform for booking a holiday house.

Saying this, it belongs to all members of the Danish Society, as does The Danish House in Penrose. So we

should be showing it the respect that we would give our own home.

We do have a cleaner who comes in to clean after your stay, but it is still your responsibility as the member who books the house to make sure the below are done before leaving and what you need to take up with you.

Please bring the below. We do not provide these things. We do not have a caretaker and even though most of our members leave some of this behind, not all of them do, so you don't want to be caught out.

- Washing Powder if you want to do more washing than the tea towels and hand towels and bathmats.
- Washing up liquid
- Rubbish Bags
- Toilet Paper
- Handy towels
- Glad wrap etc
- Oil
- **Containers** to put left-over food in that you might want to take home. If everyone takes containers from Valhalla, we won't have anything left to store left-over food in the Fridge.
- All your own bedding and towels
- **All your food etc.** I think you have the idea now.

The booking member must check Valhalla before leaving to make sure the below has been done. I have had quite a few texts and phone calls about things being left at Valhalla. If all the rooms are checked, bedrooms (also under the beds), lounge, kitchen etc., you shouldn't leave anything behind.



Valhalla Housekeeping (continued)

Check that all the below has been done.

- If there is a gas bottle that is empty it needs to be swapped at Matakana Garage email a copy of the receipt and you can take the cost off your rental cost.
- All fridges are empty and wiped out.
- Food drawers are empty and wiped out.
- Microwaves are wiped out.
- All tables and bench tops and stoves have been wiped down.
- Children's area is tidy and organised, check everything is put back complete.
- All toys are put away from outside as well and any sticks that they have been played with are removed from the lawn.
- All dog poo and rubbish is picked up from outside and the wood replaced from the BBQ area and the
 inside fire is laid ready to use.
- **Check that all Rubbish** is put into the rubbish bin on the road side NOT inside our property. If there is no room you will need to take it home with you. The bin gets emptied on a Tuesday.
- You can use the Recycling Bin which is down by our bridge before the hill for all your recycling if there is room, otherwise you need to take it home with you. We have gone to Goat Island with our recycling if it is too much for the bin.
- Please wash the Kitchen Bin and put a new rubbish bag in it.
- Check all toilets and make sure there is at least 1 roll of toilet paper in each toilet. Even a spare one would be nice. Some members are driving up to 2 hours to get to Valhalla and may need to run to the toilet, just to find no toilet paper. If we all do it, then no one will get caught out.

Just the last thing: If you have taken containers, dishes home please return them to Valhalla, or at least to the Danish House, so they can be returned to Valhalla.

We had every bed with a mattress protector on them. I can see we have quite a few missing, and these are not cheap to replace. Please bring them back clean if you took them home with your sheets. (This is an ongoing problem).



Easter

Easter is the major Christian holiday and a basic story in our culture. It is about the big questions of life and about close human experiences – hope, reconciliation, forgiveness, community, faith in life, but also failure, loneliness, suffering and death.

The story of Easter spans a dramatic week, the last week of Jesus' life, which ranges from the fellowship of the Lord's Supper, the sorrow over Jesus' suffering and death - to the joy that he rises from the dead

Easter eggs

Eggs symbolize the resurrection. Since the earliest Christianity, the egg has been used as a symbol of the resurrection. The eggshell looks dead and lifeless like the grave. But inside the shell, a new life emerges, just as Jesus broke out of the grave when he rose from death on Easter morning.

Decorating Easter eggs

It is also an old custom to decorate one's eggs. In the past, you carried an Easter basket with eggs to church on Easter Sunday and had the priest bless your eggs. In many places, there was a competition to decorate the eggs most beautifully and carry the most beautiful Easter basket to church.

Meanwhile Celina, Sarah, Adi, Liam and Zane, Mia (Jr) wheelbarrowed the existing firewood pile into the shed.

Christina Gilderdale had come up in the days prior and made a map of the worst effected moth plant areas.

The moth plants were then attacked with full force by Nicolai, Paula, Inger, Robert, Hele, Todd, Kathryn and 5 others from the Leigh Harbour Valley Society and the Leigh Coastal Care Group, collecting 25 bin sacks full of pods, they all did an excellent job

Mia and Linda did their usual magic in the kitchen making sure nobody went hungry (not even for a minute!!!)
